4-H & FFA Market Livestock Sale Broke Record, Raised

Over Half a Million Dollars

Thank you to all of the chamber members and community advocates who supported the 2017 4-H & FFA Market Livestock Sale. We have been an organizer of the sale for nearly 40 years and can confidently say this was the largest one we have ever been a part of. Even though we knew this would be a large sale, we grossly underestimated just how large it would be and how much our community would turn out to support this year's students.

This sale was supported by 122 different local buyers, beating last year's total by more than \$138,000, bringing in \$515,090 - all of which goes completely back to the students who raised each lamb, hog, or steer.

We're looking forward to next year's sale and hope to see many of you there.

Transportation Advisory Committee meets on Reserve Dr. and Willow Glen

On August 15 the Kalispell Transportation Advisory Committee met to plan for the next projects on the Kalispell urban highway system. The committee is made up of representatives of Kalispell, Flathead County, and the Montana Department of Transportation. High on the list for consideration was Reserve Drive between US 93 and Whitefish Stage, as well as Willow Glen. The committee also discussed additional highway funds coming to Kalispell under HB 473. The City is scheduled its allocation of \$324,697 in 2018, \$384,908 in 2019, and \$511,782 in 2023.
