YOU WILL GET TO SEE:

International, roundtrip airfare from Seattle, Chinese domestic airfare and tax, 4 and 5-star hotel accommodations, 3 meals per day, English speaking tour guides, motorcoach tours, and entrance fees for all attractions, plus optional tours available.

Day 1: Check in at Seattle International Airport. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide-cabin jet liner.

Day 2-5 - Beijing: In Beijing you will visit: Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world; the Palace Museum (also known as the Forbidden City), home to 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms; the Summer Palace, featuring the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake, Longevity Hill, Seventeen Arch Bridge and the Marble Boat; the Lama Temple; the Temple of Heaven, the Pearl Market and the Jade Factory. Take in sights from the 2008 Beijing Olympic Venues like the Birds Nest and Water Cube. You will also tour the Ming Tombs and have time to climb up and explore a portion of the Great Wall of China, the 4,000 mile long and 2,000 year old construction that is said to be the only man-made structure visible to the naked eye from the moon.

Day 6 - Hangzhou & Suzhou OR Xi'an

Day 6-8 - Xi'an: Tour the past capital of China for two days. Here sightseeing includes: the **Big Wild Goose Pagoda**; the Chinese Laquer Ware Workshop; **Ancient City Wall**; and the **Banpo Museum**, a preserved pre-historical caveman site. Additionally you'll visit the tomb of the first emperor of the Qin Dynasty, which is heavily guarded by nearly 8,000 **Terra Cotta Warriors**, a discovery from the 1970's that is widely considered the eighth wonder of the world.

Day 6-8 - Hangzhou & Suzhou: Spend one night in each of these incredible towns for a taste of the simpler life in modern China. Sightseeing in Suzhou includes: Tiger Hill; the Suzhou Silk Factory; the Lingering Garden and the National Embriodery Institute. Upon arriving in Hangzhou you will have the chance to relax on a boat cruise on West Lake with a stopover at the jewel-like pagodas; and visit the Lingyin Temple, featuring a 64.3 ft carving of Buddha.

Day 9-10 - Shanghai: Here you will spend two nights and see: the **Yu Gardens**, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocky works, and overarching trees; the **Bund**, Shanghai's famous waterfront park; and the **Pudong Economic Development Zone**, and the **Shanghai Silk Rug Factory**. Depart Shanghai the afternoon of day 10 where you will arrive back in Seattle earlier on the same day!

OPTIONAL TOURS

Throughout your adventure in China you will have numerous incredible experiences, opportunities to see great places, and chances to eat delicious foods. In addition to everything we have lined up for you so far, we're also offering several optional tours which are sure to provide an unforgetable experience.

BEITING: HUTONG TOUR (\$39USD)

Hutongs are traditional living areas for many of Beijing's citizens, the history of many dating back 1,000 years ago. Thousands of traditional Chinese architecture houses densly flank both sides of the narrow, zig-zag streets. Take a tour of this area on a traditional rickshaw for a taste of historical life. You will have the opportunity to eat lunch with a local family, hear about their lifestyle, and maybe even learn to cook a traditional Chinese dish.



SUZHOU: CANAL CRUISE (\$29USD)*

Spend over an hour floating through Suzhou, experiencing what life is like living on the canals. Much of the tour will take place on the Grand Canal, dug 1,300 years ago with a total length of 1,100 miles. This is the longest man-made canal in the world and one of the most famous engineering feats in all of China. You will also cruise down many of the smaller canals in the old city, passing playing children, waving laundry, and outdoor gardens. On this part of the tour you will be able to stop and explore the local market and see much of the charm that comes from living in the "Venice of the East".

SHANGHAI: ERA: THE INTERSECTION OF TIME (\$39USD)

ERA: The Intersection of Time is a fabulous live experience whose inspiration is a result of a combination of traditional Chinese acrobatic arts and modern technology. Just like Shanghai, ERA depicts a constant collision between the past and future traditions. You will be amazed by the acrobats control and precision that is only enhanced by the live music and use of tehnology, lighting, sound, and elaborate costumes. The ERA show is the first of its kind in all of China and is often compared to the icredible artistry of Cirque du Soleil.



BEIJING: THE LEGEND OF KUNG FU (\$39USD)

The Legend of Kung Fu is a high-energy, live production that combines the elements of traditional Kung Fu, story-telling, acrobatics, modern dance, and original music to celebrate the philosophy and skill of martial arts. The show tells the story of a young boy, Chun Yi (the pure one), who in order to pursue spiritual and physical harmony is apprenticed as a monk to learn traditional Kung Fu. Along the way he ovecomes obstacles, becomes tempted and distracted, but ultimately achieves the designation of a master.



SHANGHAI: MAGLEV TRAIN

The first and only commercial rail line of its type, the Shanghai Maglev train has a top speed of 431km/h; faster than Japan's world-famous bullet train. Totaling 10 billion Yuan and 2.5 years to complete, the Maglev train is powered by electromagnetism, meaning while running on a magnetic cushion the train is suspended approximately 10 milimeters above the tracks! You can take this train either one way or round trip, depending on which hotel we stay at in Shanghai. \$25 round trip or \$15 one-way. We will let you know which option you will be able to take as the trip approaches.

* Based on the scheduling each day there may be additional tours offered. Please be prepared with extra U.S. cash if you may want to participate in more.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Deposit/Payment

You will need to make a deposit of \$500 per person to secure your spot on this trip. The final balance (minus the deposit) is due by June 1, 2018. Please make all deposit/payment checks payable to the Kalispell Chamber of Commerce. Unfortunately credit cards are not accepted.

2. Final Itinerary

You will be provided with a final itinerary that includes the names, addresses, and phone numbers of the hotels and all of your international flight information approximately 1 month before trip departure. Be sure to leave a copy with someone at home and always carry a copy with you on the trip.

3. International Flights

The final flight number, departure gate, departure time, and your e-ticket number will be made available to your prior to departure. You will need your e-ticket number to check-in. We strongly suggest you arrive in Seattle the day before departure – if you are late to the flight, we can't wait for you. Please check into your flight no 3.5 hours before the departure time. You will want to check in this early to ensure a good seat assignment. Seat assignments will not be made prior to check-in. All flights are on regularly scheduled Boeing 747, 777, or 787 aircraft. The flight is approximately 12 hours and will feature 2 meals and a large selection of movies.

4. Luggage

You are allowed to check in 2 pieces of luggage (max. 50 pounds each, but 70 as total) per person plus carry-on (i.e. luggage and a purse/laptop/briefcase).

5. Frequent Flyer Miles

Airlines normally do not count mileage to group travelers. But you can still try your luck when you receive your e-ticket number. You cannot use your mileage points to upgrade seats on this trip, since it is already discounted.

6. Arrival

Upon your arrival to Beijing Airport please wear the name badge that will be provided to you. We will meet as a group before heading through immigration and customs. Once through customs, we will head to baggage claim where you will look for your bus number, held by your tour guide. The tour guide leads you to board your pre-assigned bus where your adventure will begin!

7. Hotels

Hotels are 4 and 5 star. All of the hotels have Western facilities and include hair dryers and internet service. If you bring electrical appliances or gadgets that will need charging, it is recommended that you bring electrical adapters/converters. Unless otherwise notified, all rooms will be booked as non-smoking.

8. Meals

Breakfast will be a Western and Eastern buffet at the hotel. Lunch and dinner are family style at local Chinese restaurants where soft drinks and beer are served.

9. Water

It is not recommended that you drink any tap water. Bottled water is available at the hotel or can be purchased on the bus or from local vendors for a few dollars.

10. Daily Schedule

You will wake up around 6:30 am to get ready, eat breakfast and be ready to leave the hotel at approximately 8:00 am for the day's tours. You're likely to return around 8:00 pm each day. If you wish to leave the group (or not join the group for the day), let your bus tour guide know.

11. Bus Travel

Travel with the same group of people throughout the entire trip, and each group will have its own bus. Each bus will usually take 20-30 passengers. You can leave personal items on the bus for the day but take valuables with you.

12. Business Conference

For those interested in making business contacts in Beijing you will have the opportunity to meet with government officials and business leaders after dinner at the hotel. Please fill out the "Business Inquiry Form" and return it to the trip planner so we can arrange to have the apropriate people there. Dress for this event is "business attire".

13. **Optional Tours**

Optional tours will be available for an additional charge. The tour guides will describe them to you and if interested, you will pay the guides in cash (USD/CAD). If you are interested in any of the optional tours, we suggest you keep the exact amount of cash in an envelope, labeled for each option. Please see the attached flyer for the available optional tours. Note: if you are traveling to Xi'an, you are not able to attend the optional tour in Suzhou.

14. Dress

Dress comfortably and in layers. There is no time to change clothes during the day. Bring a coat, dress in layers, wear comfortable walking shoes. Jeans are OK for all venues. We higly recommend bringing a raincoat – the weather in October in China is similar to the weather in Montana; it can change quickly and range from warm and sunny to cool and rainy.

15. **Shopping**

We will be visiting factory stores, but don't feel obligated to buy anything. If you purchase anything from a street vendor be prepared to bargain; do not pay the intial asking price. Many stores are able to ship purchases home for you.

16. Tipping

Tips are not included in the trip fee. Total tips for all of your tour guides are \$39 and will be collected by your guide in Beijing. If you receive special services, an additional tip is not necessary, but OK if you wish.

17. Passport & Chinese Visa

You are responsible for obtaining your own passport that must be valid for a minimum of 6 months after our return date. Chinese travel visas are valid for 10 years, or until your passport expires. The Kalispell Chamber will handle the Chinese visa process for you, but you will need to provide the following: your physical passport, two official passport photos, the Visa application form (complete boxes # 1.1, 1.15, 1.17, 1.18, 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 4.3 and sign), and a check for \$155 made out to the Kalispell Chamber of Commerce. After we send your packet off, your passport with the Chinese visa included will be returned to you in a couple weeks. Passport collection will begin in June.

18. Shots/Vaccinations

Special shots or vaccinations are not required to enter or travel in China. Check with your personal physician regarding your situation.

19. Travel Insurance

Citslinc buys Post Departure Travel Insurance policy for each passenger, but it does not cover if you decide to cancel the trip. The policy information will be available to you within 45 days of the trip departure.

20. Money/Currency

Most stores will accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express. Discover Card is not generally accepted. You can exchange USD/CAD and traveler's checks at many of the hotels, and at the airports, although US dollars are welcome almost everywhere. If you take US cash, take small denominations, and please be aware some placeswill not accept highly-used and wrinkled money. Street vendors do not like to give change. ATMs are available in the hotel lobby. Tip: Contact your credit card company to notify them you will be using your card in China.

21. Single Travelers

If you are traveling alone and do not wish to pay the additional private single room fee (single room supplement), we will match you with a traveler of the same gender who is also in your travel group.

22. Cell Phones

Your cell phone works in China, only after you buy the international service from your provider. There is WiFi available in all hotels.

23. Additional Travel

If you want to leave the group during the tour, please notify your bus tour guide. If you want to do additional traveling after the tour, check with your own travel agent. It is possible, but you will be responsible for all additional costs and arrangements.
